Introduction: What is Assembly Bill (AB) 480?

- If it is reasonably determined that the release or entry poses an imminent **and** substantial endangerment to public health due to factors, including, but not limited to, carcinogenicity, acute and/or chronic toxicity, bio accumulative properties, or persistence in the air or environment, the UPA may take the following actions:
 - Order issue an order to the responsible party to immediately suspend or discontinue the activity causing or contributing to the release, spill, escape, or entry of the hazardous material, hazardous waste, or hazardous substance. The order shall remain in effect until the UPA determines that the imminent and substantial endangerment to public health has been abated.
 - Coordinate with other appropriate regulatory agencies that may take any other action necessary to protect the public health, including, but not limited to, environmental investigations and temporary relief to, or relocation of, affected individuals.

What is AB 48o?

- Authorize Unified Program Agencies (UPAs):
 - Without a declaration of a local health emergency, if a release, spill, escape, or entry, as described, of a hazardous material, hazardous waste, or hazardous substance occurs
 - In consultation with the **local health officer** (Must consult with LHO)
 - To make a reasonable determination that it poses an imminent AND substantial endangerment to public health
 - Issue an order to the responsible party to immediately suspend or discontinue the activity



What is AB 480? cont.

- Requires UPAs to support its order with written findings
- Requires evidence of **local health officer consultation**
- Must be consistent with criteria developed by UPAs
 - To determine whether an imminent **AND** substantial endangerment to public health has occurred



What is AB 48o? cont.

- Preclude the UPA from issuing an order **if** the release, spill, escape, or entry of a hazardous material, hazardous waste, or hazardous substance:
 - falls below a reporting threshold established by the office in any regulation

Provide the responsible party an opportunity to appeal the order



Methodology, Development, and Next Steps

- The CUPA Forum Board formed a **multi-agency workgroup** to develop criteria for decision-making for UPAs to use
- Workgroup consists of **local and State experts** in hazardous materials, public health, and emergency response: CA Waterboard, CalEPA, DTSC, LA City, LA County, and OEHHA
- Workgroup has been meeting for over one-year to **develop criteria**
- Draft criteria to aid UPAs in decision-making process and provide additional resources



Development of AB 480 Criteria

- Developed draft two-page decision tree with supporting/additional resources
