- > 1970's
- Minamata, Japan 1968
- DDT banned 1972
- Yusho, Japan PCBs banned 1976
- Love Canal 1979
- > 1980's
- Stringfellow Acid Pits 1982
- Times Beach, Missouri 1982
- Bhopal, India 1984 3,800 dead, 558,000 injured
- Exxon Valdez Oil Spill 1989








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#### FEDERAL ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS

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## EPA/State Health Agencies — Late 1970's

 Original State agencies involved with regulating Hazardous Waste at larger Transfer Storage Disposaltype facilities – CA Dept of Health Services

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## **Early 1980's**

 Local hazardous waste programs started in about 22 local agencies

Numerous criminal cases for spills and accidents







## 1980's – Explosive Program Growth

- UST Sher Bill
- Business Plan Chemical Inventories– 1986
- Local Oversight Program 1988
- Major Cleanup Efforts
- Increasing Fines, Penalties & Felonies
- > More Fire Dept. Involvement
- Military Base Closures







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#### 1990's - CalEPA/DTSC



California
Environmental
Protection Agency

- > 1991 CalEPA created
- > 1991 DTSC moved from DHS to CalEPA
- Emphasis toward innovation; pollution prevention, waste reduction, etc.
- 1994+ Unified Program (CUPAs)
   Development and Certifications
- > 1997 CalARP



#### January 1994 – SB 1082

- > Why a Unified Program?
  - Duplicate inspections
  - Duplicate programs
  - Multiple invoicing and permitting
  - Multiple agencies
- What happened?
  - Legislative process
  - Political climate then and now

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# Certified Unified Program Agencies and Participating Agencies

- > 81 CUPAs most with no PAs
- > 24 PAs via agreements
- Most are "fire" or "environmental health" entities
- > State certification process in mid 1990's
- > 1990's also was the time where CUPA regulations were developed
- > Ongoing State evaluation of implementation of the program


## Regulated Universe 2020-2021

- Business Plan Facilities: 148,089
- CalARP Facilities: 2,017
- Hazardous Waste Facilities: 94,066
- Underground Tank Facilities: 13,696
- Aboveground Tank Facilities: 17,834



## Unified Program Led to the CUPA Forum

- > 1996 UPAs unite in a CUPA Forum to consolidate efforts and provide a single voice to the State and federal agencies
- > 1998 UPAAG established
- > 1998 CUPA Forum begins holding annual conferences


